When Hazelwood School District cancels classes due to inclement weather, all recreation programs scheduled to begin prior to 4:30 p.m. are canceled. Decisions will be made regarding programs scheduled after 4:30 p.m., and every effort will be made to notify participants by telephone prior to the class time. Membership Programs & Daily Fees

Resident Identification Card

A current Resident card is required, for ages 6 and older, for access to the Recreation Facilities, to obtain picnic permits, admittance to White Birch Bay Aquatic Center, to fish at Truman Pond, and to receive resident rates for classes and room rentals. Resident cards expire annually on December 31st. Card renewal fee is free with current proof of residency.

Proof of Residency Requirements

Individuals, age 21 and older, must provide a valid photo I.D. (Driver's License, State I.D., employment, education) and one of the following: UNPAID utility bill, received within the last 30 days, bearing your Hazelwood address, a monthly business statement, or your Personal Property Tax receipt. Assistance in determining other items which may be used of proof of residency is available by calling 314-731-0980. Non-residents purchasing I.D. cards must also provide this information.

Non-Resident Identification Card

Non-Residents wishing to use the Recreation facilities must obtain a City issued I.D. card for facility access.

Procedures

1. Parents/Guardians may obtain resident cards for themselves and all other family members, age 6-20, by presenting proof of residency and photo I.D. Because the I.D. cards are printed immediately on site, all family members are encouraged to be present at the time of purchase.
2. Adult family members, 21 years of age and older, residing with parents/guardians must present their own current proof of residency and photo I.D. when applying for resident cards.

Facility Usage Fees

An annual facility usage fee, *Premier Pass*, is required for access to the Recreation Facilities gyms, weight rooms, track and game rooms. Individuals must be 14 years of age, and have a signed release waiver on file, to use the weight rooms. Individuals must be 12 years of age to use the walking/jogging track without direct adult supervision.

Registration

Registration Policies

1. Registrations are on a first-come, first served basis and will continue until the classes are filled.
2. Resident cards must be current and presented at the time of registration to qualify for resident rates.
3. You may register for any class session. Registration in the first session does not guarantee a place in continuing classes.
4. Participants must reach the designated age by the first class.
5. Fees are calculated per session unless otherwise indicated.
6. Pre-registration is required for all programs unless otherwise indicated.

Senior Citizen Rates

Residents, age 55 years and over, are entitled to a 50% discount for most CLASS registrations. A CLASS consists of any recreation offering which meets on a continuing weekly basis during a 4 week or greater session. This discount is not available for all programs and will be noted in the class description.

Transfers

Should you find it necessary to transfer session or class times, this may be done prior to the start of the session or class for which you are registered if an opening exists.

Returned Checks

Returned checks are assessed all bank fees charged to the City.

Insurance Information

The City of Hazelwood Parks and Recreation Division assumes no liability for injuries that may be incurred by participants in programs or use of facilities. Users are urged to provide adequate medical insurance coverage and be aware that expenses incurred for medical treatment or care are to be borne by the individual participant. Please make sure you are in good condition for those activities which require physical exertion.

Cancellations and Refunds

The City of Hazelwood Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel or postpone any program due to insufficient enrollment or other valid reason. A full refund will be issued if a class is canceled. If an individual cannot attend a class or program for any reason, refunds will be issued upon written request for classes as follows:

1. For activities with a fee, a written request must be submitted within the first two class periods in order to receive a refund or transfer to another class. A \$15 service charge will be made for withdrawals after the first class meeting.
2. All trips and tours have registration deadlines. In order to receive a refund, a written request must be received prior to that deadline. After that, refunds will be given only if a replacement is found.

Minimum/Maximum

All program/class fees are calculated on a minimum number of participants. If the set minimum is not met for any given class, the class will be cancelled and refunds will be made to those registered. It is recommended that you register a minimum of five days before the start of a program.



Senior Transportation Services

Hazelwood Parks and Recreation provides free curbside bus transportation to qualified City residents for personal business such as doctor appointments, hair appointments, grocery shopping and banking. To qualify for this service you must:

- Be a City of Hazelwood resident.
- Be 55 years of age or older or disabled with medical verification.
- Complete and sign an application for service and submit it to either Recreation Office. Applications are available at either Recreation Office.
- Applicant must not have any condition that requires special medical attention which might adversely affect the health of other participants riding the bus.
- Accommodations that may be needed are the responsibility of the rider: service animal, oxygen, personal assistance, walker, etc
- When the Hazelwood School District closes due to inclement weather, the Senior Bus service also cancels.

Making a Reservation

To make a reservation, call 314-839-5575, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Riders must call at least 48 hours in advance.

- Reservations will be made in 30 minute increments.
- Riders should be ready 30 minutes prior to their designated pick-up time. Be patient with the drivers who may be delayed at times due to traffic or other reasons.
- Appointments will be accepted up to one month in advance.
- Calls for service less than 48 hours in advance will be accommodated based on priorities and availability.
- Riders are limited to one trip per day and two per week. Riders are accommodated according to the below Priority

Rating Scale:

1. Medical
2. Grocery Shopping
3. Financial Business, Post Office
4. Shopping, Recreational, etc.

Cancellations should be made 24 hours in advance when possible. Cancellations on shorter notice should still be called in to the recreation office at 314-839-5575.

FOR AGES 55 & OVER.

The "Hazelnuts" is the senior activity organization sponsored by the City of Hazelwood for over 45 years. The Hazelnuts invite all Hazelwood residents, age 55 and over, to join them. The annual membership dues are \$12 per person. The group meets monthly on the second Wednesday of the month at the Civic Center East, 8969 Dunn Road, beginning at 10:30a.m.

The Hazelnuts monthly meeting includes updates on Hazelwood activities and City Council actions. Each month entertainment, speakers and activities are provided during the meeting. During the past year speakers included Police Chief Hudanick, Fire Chief Luley, DePaul Hospital Outreach, and St. Louis County Library. Ms. Barbara Kay re-enacted Betsy Ross on Flag Day and Mr. Lamarr Pilsing entertained with vocal music.

January through March, snacks are provided for members. For the last nine months of the year, catered meals, from a variety of local restaurants, are enjoyed following the entertainment. Members must register and pay for the meal, which costs \$12. In December a holiday party is held which includes a special lunch, bingo and other activities.

The City of Hazelwood Parks and Recreation Division offers free Senior bus service to residents, age 55 and over. Rides to and from the Hazelnut meetings can be provided for you.

Parks and Recreation Policies

Facility Usage - Children

Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult, age 16 or older, at all times while utilizing the Community Center or Civic Center East.

Special Recreation Needs

The City of Hazelwood strives to make recreation programs accessible to everyone. If you have a special need, in order to participate in a program, please inform office staff at the time of registration or call 731-0980 or by TDD 1-711 two weeks in advance between 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. Every effort will be made to adapt the program to incorporate your individual need.

Acceptance of Participation

Rules of acceptance and participation in the following programs are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, or disability.

Program Registration

Registrations are on a first-come, first-served basis and are accepted until the enrollment is filled. It is recommended that you register a minimum of five days prior to the start of the program to ensure your spot in the class.

Termination of Participation

Any park user, program participant, or spectator who strikes, attempts to strike, verbally threatens, or attempts to intimidate a Parks and Recreation employee or cause such employee or another park patron to be apprehensive about his/her personal safety; or who persists in the use of vulgar and inappropriate language in addressing an employee or at a recreation program or facility; or who fails to heed the request of an on-site supervisor to vacate park property is subject to prosecution for violation of the City of Hazelwood trespassing ordinance and suspension from attendance at recreation programs or facilities for a period to be determined by the Director of Parks and Recreation.

Bleeding Policy

In any Parks and Recreation program, a participant who is bleeding or who has blood on his/her clothing shall be prohibited from participating further in the activity until appropriate treatment has been administered. Appropriate treatment may include bandaging as necessary to prevent recurrence.

Photograph Policy

Photographs taken during programs and activities sponsored by the Hazelwood Parks and Recreation Division are the property of the City of Hazelwood and may be reproduced without consent of the participants.

Skate/BMX Park Operating Schedule

The Skate Park will be open daily, weather permitting. The park will be closed on those holidays when the Recreation Center is closed. The park will be opened upon request. The surface must be 100% dry for the Skate Park to open.

Sunday-Thursday the park will close at 8:30p.m.

Friday-Saturday the park will close at 4:30p.m.

Skate/BMX Park Usage

The Hazelwood Skate park is free to use.

There is no attendant on duty.

The risk of injury from this activity is significant, including the potential for permanent disability and death.

No liability, either expressed or implied, will be incurred by the City, or its employees, for any injuries arising out of the use of the facility. It is recommended to use the facility with a companion or group.

Helmets may be rented from the Recreation Office for \$1.00.

The Recreation Office also has several accessory items for

purchase such as helmets, pads, tubes, etc.



*Parties for individuals age 13 - 19 are prohibited.

*Not-for-Profit organizations are required to pay all rental fees based on residency.

***Alcohol by permit ONLY. NO GLASS containers of any kind.**


*A \$60 reservation fee is required for all Resident Park Pavilion Reservations.
