HAZELWOOD CELEBRATING 75TH ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the formation of Hazelwood as a City and officials are making plans to celebrate.

On October 14, 1969, voters approved the City charter adopting a Home Rule Council Manager form of government. In 1970, a Mayor and City Council was elected with Homer Birchler serving as Hazelwood's first mayor.

Mayor Matt Robinson and the City Council has established a 75th Anniversary Committee and they are currently setting up plans to commemorate the event with a number of programs. The celebration will commence at Hazelwood Day on Saturday, September 7th.



LIMB COLLECTION UNDERWAY



The Hazelwood Streets Department has begun our annual Limb Collection for City residents. This popular service was restored in 2023 by the City Council with the hopes to continue this every year.

The service started the first week of April and will continue until early May. Public Works has designated specific areas for each week.

Residents should stack trimmings at the curb by 7:00 am the Monday morning of their designated week with the cut end facing the street. Crews will collect brush on each street one time only during the scheduled collection week. It is important that you abide by the schedule.

Branches should not be cut into short pieces. Please do not put any wire, metal, trash, garden waste or other debris in the brush that is to be chipped because this could cause serious injury to the crew and damage the chipper. CITY, STATE CREATE NEW WORKFORCE INCENTIVE

The City of Hazelwood has announced a partnership with the Missouri Department of Economic Development to create an innovative program to help new and existing industries.

The Hazelwood Relocation Assistance Program (H-RAP) will mirror the Missouri One Start's relocation incentive to help industries offset relocation costs for new employees who are not residents of the state. One Start is a division of the State of Missouri.



Missouri One Start provides tailored workforce strategies to address unique business needs at no cost to an eligible businesses. The agency will customize services ranging from pre-employment screening and recruitment to designing job-specific training both during and after the onboarding process.

Specifically, as part of Missouri One Start's training programs, eligible companies could receive reimbursement up to \$3,500 for each full-time employee who relocates to Missouri for a new job with the company. To receive this benefit, a company must apply and be approved for training assistance through Missouri One Start and specifically request relocation assistance.

The city will match any funds the state provides to a Hazelwood business for relocation of the same new employee. Monies are given as a reimbursement to cover relocation expenses of new employees that previously were not Missouri residents.

"We're excited to embark on this creative new partnership between Missouri One Start and the City of Hazelwood," said Michelle Hataway, Acting Director of the Department of Economic Development.

Relocation assistance is an effective way to encourage business investment that strengthens communities and our state's economy. This new program will make a powerful economic development tool even more useful for companies that choose to grow in Hazelwood.

Hazelwood City Manager Matt Zimmerman stated affiliating with the state not only makes sense, but continues to demonstrate how strong partnerships benefits everyone.

There is no limitation on where the individual must live as long as they become a Missouri resident from an out-of-state location.

In addition, not only will Hazelwood match the state's reimbursement, but it will provide a similar incentive to the employee if the individual purchases a home in the corporate limits of Hazelwood.

HAZELNUTS

The Hazelnuts is the senior activity organization which is sponsored by the City of Hazelwood for over 45 years. The Hazelnuts invite all Hazelwood residents, age 55 or over to join them. The annual membership dues are \$12 per person. The group meets monthly on the second Wednesday of the month at the Civic Center East 8969 Dunn Road, beginning at 10:30 a.m.

The Hazelnuts meeting includes updates on Hazelwood activities and city council updates. Each month we enjoy entertainment, lectures, and guest speakers on topics important to our members.

During the months of January, February and March we provide snacks and the rest of the year we cater food from several restaurants to enjoy after the entertainment. The cost of the meal is \$12 for members who register and pay for their meal. In December we host a holiday lunch and party for members. After lunch members can stay and play bingo or enjoy other activities.

COUNCILMAN NAMED IRAQ VETERAN OF THE YEAR

Hazelwood Ward 7 Council Member Robert Smith was presented with the 2023 Iraq Veteran of the Year, awarded by the Veterans Coalition of Greater St. Louis at the Florissant Veteran's Day Parade.

Councilman Smith served in the Army from 1987 - 2008, split between Active Duty and the National Guard. He served in Desert Storm with the 101st Airborne Division, UN's operation in Somalia in 1993 where he fought in the



Battle of Mogadishu and Operation Iraqi Freedom with the IL National Guard's 233rd Military Police Company in 2003 - 2004. He also oversaw the work to rebuild three Iraqi police stations in Al-Mesbah, Al-Karrada and Baghdad Judea and conducted almost daily combat patrols in those neighborhoods in Baghdad.



His highest awards were the Combat Action Badge, the Meritorious Service Medal and the Soldier's Medal for Heroism. He earned the Soldier's Medal after entering a burning apartment building to rescue civilians while on patrol in Baghdad.

In addition, Councilmember Robert Smith received a proclamation from Mayor Matt Robinson and the Hazelwood City Council for the recognition from the Veteran's Coalition of Greater St. Louis.

The Mayor, with the unanimous support from the City Council, recognized the councilman as its first ever "Hazelwood Veteran of the Year." After the presentation, Mayor Robinson announced that from this point forward, every year the City will honor a Hazelwood Resident Veteran of the Year along with a Hazelwood City Employee Veteran of the Year. Councilman Smith was joined by his wife and son for the well-deserved award.

The City of Hazelwood Community Enrichment Commission will soon begin judging for the Blue Ribbon Home Awards, to be presented in the Fall of 2024. The program recognizes Hazelwood residents who keep their homes and yards in immaculate condition, making Hazelwood a more attractive place to live. Beginning in the Spring, late April and May, the Commission members drive the city streets looking for homes to nominate for the Blue Ribbon Award. Homes are judged for their "curb appeal" based on the upkeep of the home, yard and any viewable structures. Six to eight individual homes and one Multi-Family Dwelling complex from each City Ward are nominated for final judging. During the month of June, the Commission members again drive the streets of the City judging the nominated homes. Two homes from each City Ward and one Multi-family Dwelling from the City are then selected as the Blue Ribbon Homes of the year. These homeowners are awarded a Blue Ribbon Award and honored at a City Council meeting in August.

The Blue Ribbon Home Award program is held every two years. Residents may also nominate homes for this honor by calling the Recreation Office at (314) 731-0980 and giving the address of the deserving home.

The completion of the \$278 million I-270 North Project was celebrated with an official ceremony on December 12th in Hazelwood. Missouri Governor Mike Parson joined state and local elected officials along with the Missouri Department of Transportation and contractor team to cut the ribbon on this four-year long makeover.

CITY CELEBRATES MARSON FOODS OPENING

Marson Foods, LLC, a premier manufacturer of quality waffle products for K12 and Food Service, officially opened their new \$35 million, 147,000 square foot baking facility in Hazelwood. The company's expansion to the area includes the establishment of a modern distribution facility and automated production lines to increase their sales capacity.



Marson Foods Co-owner, Jan Marson, believes they are poised for success in Hazelwood. "We saw the momentum in Hazelwood, and we wanted to contribute to that job creation and economic growth." She adds, "Our facility's advanced technologies will allow us to continue to use the highest quality ingredients to create millions of

of nutritious meals that will not only be sold to schools around the country, but will feed those in need. We are grateful that the State of Missouri believed in our vision and were a supportive partner in this endeavor."

Marson Foods began operations at the Hazelwood facility in October 2023, hiring 16 employees at a salary well above the average for the St. Louis County. While they are currently producing approximately 1 million waffles per week, their goal is to increase production to 2 million waffles per week by the end of 2024.



The Marson Foods Bakery is just the latest facility to open in Kansas City-based NorthPoint Development's Hazelwood Tradeport, a 355-acre

industrial park. The City of Hazelwood and the Missouri Department of Economic Development facilitated the Marson Foods' investment, and believe their company culture of serving the community, commitment to above average wages and diversifying the workforce, and their plans to expand make this new facility an exciting addition to the local economy.
