COUNCIL APPROVES FY26 BUDGET

In late June, members of the Hazelwood City Council approved the Fiscal Year 2026 General and Capital Funds Budgets. The City operates on a July 1st to June 30th fiscal year.

David Tuberty, Director of Finance, reported the FY'25 will end with just under a \$1 Million surplus. This was based on conservative financial practices and projected spending, which has been a standard practice by officials for many years.


Tuberty estimated FY'26 revenues at \$50.5 Million with anticipated expenses of \$54.3 Million projected a \$3.7 Million deficit.

It was further pointed out every year we anticipate a deficit budget but are able to reduce or eliminate that gap due to sound financial practices. Even with these projections, the City is estimating a \$22 Million fund balance.

The City's Capital Improvement Fund is expected to fund normal capital expenditures such as improvements to the City Garage, engineering and design work for a possible new firehouse and the purchase of squad cars.

Hazelwood's Debt Service is producing strong results. The City has 2005 & 2007 Street bonds that will be paid off in FY'26; bonds for the Aquatic Center to be paid off in FY'27 and a leased fire truck with payments ending in FY'29. Our total outstanding debt balance at the beginning of the fiscal year stands at \$1.2 Million.

The Council began preparations in April with a Work Session and held a public hearing on the budget prior to its final approval.



COUNCIL MEMBERS RE-ELECTED

In April, residents voted to return all incumbent Council members to their positions with all receiving oaths of office later that month.



After the ballots were certified by St. Louis County, City Clerk Julie Lowery swore each member into office with Mayor Matt Robinson standing beside them.

POLICE RECEIVE MADD AWARDS

Members of the Hazelwood Police Department were recently recognized by Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Heartland for their efforts to combat drunk and impaired driving.

Officer Shane Olmsted was awarded the MADD Century Award, a prestigious distinction given to law enforcement officers who make 100 or more DWI arrests within a single calendar year. Officer Olmsted is one of only 17 officers across the entire State of Missouri to earn this recognition.

Chief James Hudanick received the MADD Roll Call Award recognizing law enforcement leaders who go above and beyond in the fight against impaired driving. Under his leadership, the Hazelwood Police Department has prioritized DUI enforcement, supported public awareness efforts like Saturation Saturday and DWI Checkpoints, and worked in close coordination with advocacy partners like MADD to make our community safer.

In addition, MADD Heartland were in attendance to honored Police Officers Michal Andreatta, Brandon Runyon, Jeffrey Lakebrink, Brandon Ulm, Daniel Johnston, Joshua West, and Shane Olmsted with the MADD Heroes Awards.

These seven officers were responsible for 169 of the 192 DWI arrests in 2024.

All received a standing ovation while receiving these awards at a recent Hazelwood City Council Meeting.

United States Handball Association also announced at the




event the St. Louis Hinder Club was recognized as the National Club of the Year.
