Road Construction Projects

This year, MoDOT kicks off their I-270 North Project and the City begins preparing for Phantom Drive’s reconstruction. **MoDOT’s I-270 North Project** begins this summer and they expect it to take approximately four years to complete. MoDOT will be doing work to the highway, bridges, side roads and highway ramps along Interstate 270 North between McDonnell Boulevard and Bellefontaine Road, improving the safety and reliability of the corridor.

In Hazelwood, MoDOT will be replacing the Lindbergh bridge over I-270 with a split diamond interchange and will add an additional lane on I-270 between Lindbergh and Route 367. MoDOT will remove all crossover slip ramps on the outer roads and add traffic signals and pedestrian access upgrades as well. Additionally, the City will begin the process of reconstructing the entirety of **Phantom Drive** between Missouri Bottom Road and McDonnell Boulevard. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2022 but the City will start with design and engineering work this year. The reconstruction project will take the four existing narrow lanes and turn them in to two wider lanes, more suitable for heavy truck traffic. We will be adding left turn bays at the intersections and a 6’ sidewalk along one side of the road. Tornado Safety Tips

With the nicer weather here, the risk for tornadoes increases. If you hear a tornado siren go off (outside) or warning on the radio/TV, here are steps you should take:

- If you're in a house, go down to the basement.
- If you're in a building with no basement, go to a small interior room on the lowest level.
- Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls.
- Use your arms to protect your head and neck from flying debris.
- Listen to EAS or NOAA Weather Radio for emergency information.
- Do not try to outrun a tornado in a vehicle.
- If you are in a car or outdoors and cannot get to a building, get as low as you can such as in a ditch, cover your head and neck with your arms, and cover your body with a coat or blanket, if possible. Do NOT seek shelter under an overpass. Their under-the-girder-type construction can cause a dangerous wind tunnel effect.

Be safe afterwards by following these suggestions:

- Keep listening to EAS, NOAA Weather Radio, and local authorities for updated information.
- If you are trapped, cover your nose and mouth to avoid breathing dust. Try to send a text, bang on a pipe or wall, or use a whistle instead of shouting.
- Stay clear of fallen power lines or broken utility lines.
- Do not enter damaged buildings until you are told they are safe.
- Phone systems are often down or busy after a disaster. Use text messaging or social media to communicate with family and friends.
- Be careful during clean up. Wear thick-soled shoes, long pants, and work gloves.



Lifesaving Award and Citizen Service Citations

On November 19, 2019, at 12:09 p.m. Police Officer Daniel Rodriguez responded to a call that a driver was having a seizure near Elm Grove Lane and North Lindbergh. Two bystanders who were already on scene, Richard Vantree of Hazelwood and Edward Crain of Godfrey, IL, pulled the driver from his car. Vantree, Crain, and Officer Rodriguez took turns performing chest compressions and CPR until paramedics arrived. Once the paramedics arrived and took over, they used a defibrillator three separate times before finally getting a pulse.

Much to Officer Rodriguez's surprise, the driver was retired Hazelwood Police Captain George Schwartz who served the City for nearly 20 years. Due to the efforts of Officer Rodriguez, Vantree, and Crain, Captain Schwartz made a full recovery after spending several days in the Intensive Care Unit. Officer Rodriguez received Hazelwood Police Department's Lifesaving Award. Vantree and Crain received Citizen Service Citations.

This is the second time in less than one year that Officer Rodriguez has received an award. He received the Distinguished Service Citation of Valor in July 2019 for rescuing a grandmother and her three-year-old granddaughter from a house fire.

May is Building Safety Month



In May, the International Code Council (ICC) is celebrating the 40th Annual Building Safety Month. This year’s theme is “Safer Buildings, Safer Communities, Safer World.”

Building codes are the government’s

official statement on building safety – they are essential pieces to the building and construction process – outlining necessary standards related to structural stability, fire and weather hazard protection, electrical wiring safety, evacuation pathways, and more.

Code officials are responsible for ensuring the safety and compliance of these codes and standards. They inspect building plans and construction processes to guarantee every building constructed follows these sets of codes and standards designed to ensure safety for the community.

Common Code Violations

As the grass turns green, there are a few code violations that our Code Enforcement Officers deal with on a regular basis. Remember:

- Grass/weeds should be maintained below 8” in height.
- Trash cans must be stored behind the front building line of your home (not in front of garage door).
- Exterior maintenance of property must be kept up, including cleaning of siding and removal of vegetation from gutters.
- Do not park your cars on unimproved surfaces or grass. Cars must be parked on hard surfaces such as asphalt or concrete.

Economic Development Update

This is an exciting time in Hazelwood with new event space opening and more businesses moving into the city. Here is a brief update on what is going on:


- **Aviator Business Park** continues to build out, adding two buildings, including the large building by Lindbergh Blvd.
- **Gujarati Samaj of St. Louis**, an Indian Social Club, gave the old Hazelwood Bowl site a massive makeover, redeveloping and renovating it into a large meeting space and banquet facility. They held their ribbon cutting March 14 and the space is now available for hosting events.
- **Silgan Plastics** is working with City Staff on a potential expansion of their current facility. The new addition would bring 50 research and development jobs here over the next year.
- **Village Square** will start façade improvements and will have more parking lot improvements this spring. Additionally, the owner/developer, Somera Road, teamed up with the Hazelwood Industrial Development Authority and the City to offer a competitive grant for small businesses looking to locate in Village Square.

I-270 Hazardous Driving Enforcement



In anticipation of MoDOT's I-270 North Project, the Bridgeton, Florissant, Hazelwood, St. Louis

County Police Departments, along with the Missouri State Highway Patrol, have created a joint I-270 Enforcement Group. This group is working together to decrease dangerous, aggressive, and hazardous driving on the area's busiest interstate with the goal of reducing the dangerous driving that occurs every day.

These police departments will work together during the coming months to present a high visibility enforcement effort. Officers from the various departments will work as teams to focus on the most serious traffic violators – hazardous moving violations, such as speeding, following too close, and improper lane use and changes, and seatbelt enforcement on I-270. The enforcement campaign will focus on the times and days when hazardous moving violations are most prevalent and enforcement can be most useful.

Hazardous moving violations are the most common factors in crashes along this area of I-270. A study of accident statistics since 2017 revealed there were over 1,800 traffic crashes in the area between Bridgeton, Hazelwood, and Florissant and over 1,200 of those crashes were reported to have hazardous moving violations attributed to the cause of the incident.

The campaign is partially funded through on-going MoDOT traffic safety grants. The enforcement campaign will continue as the need to conduct operations is necessary and in coordination with scheduled MoDOT construction operations.

Queen Ann Park Improvements

Queen Ann Park is getting a facelift this summer, thanks to a Municipal Park Grant that provides 95% of the funding for the improvements. The new improvements include a new 20' x 42' steel pavilion and concrete pad, a large destination type custom rope/cable play feature, 50' of zip lines with ADA engineered wood fiber surfacing, a playground with poured-in-place surfacing, and new upgraded swings.

Crews will begin tearing out the old equipment at the end of April and the City anticipates all the improvements will be done by the end of July.



Hazelwood's Aquatic Center Opens in May

Dive into summer fun when the City of Hazelwood's White Birch Bay Aquatic Center opens for the 2020 season on Saturday, May 23. While Hazelwood schools are still in session, the facility will only be open on weekends (Saturday and Sunday). Once school is out for the summer, the daily hours of operation are from noon to 6 p.m.

For the pools to open, the temperature must reach 75 degrees before noon. Text SWIMWB to 84483 for text alerts on closures. If the temperature falls below 75 degrees after 4 p.m., the facility will close. In addition, the Aquatic Center closes at 5 p.m. on days when Hazelwood hosts a swim meet.

2020 Census

April 1, 2020, is Census Day – the day that officially kicks off the 2020 Census. The United States Constitution mandates that the nation performs a population census every 10 years and the goal for the 2020 Census is to count everyone once, only once, and in the right place, and at a lower cost per household than the 2010 Census.

What is the census? The census is a questionnaire or a survey. It only asks nine questions and it counts every living adult and child in the United States.

Why should I complete the census? The census impacts the community you live in, from school lunches and plans for highways to support for firefighters and families in need. For every adult and every child that is not counted, Missouri will lose \$1,300 in federal dollars every year. That adds up to \$13,000 per person over the next 10 years – money that could be used for roads and bridges, hospitals, and schools.

What does the census ask? The census asks nine simple questions about the people living in your household. This includes name, age, race, sex, and if you own or rent your home. The census will NOT ask for your income, political party, or citizenship status.

What is the Census 2020 timeline?

In early March, you should have started receiving invitations from the U.S. Census Bureau with instructions on how to complete the census. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online at www.2020census.gov, by phone, or by mail.

In May through July, census takers will visit homes of people who have not responded. In December, the Census Bureau will deliver apportionment counts to the President and Congress as required by law.

By March 31, 2021, the Census Bureau will send redistricting counts to states. Those counts will be used to redraw legislative districts based on population changes.



What about special living situations? Many people have special living situations such as college students, military service members, individuals experiencing homelessness, and people in correctional facilities. You can find more information about how the U.S. Census Bureau is working with different organizations to handle these special living situations on their website at www.2020census.gov.

Is my information secure? Yes, your information is secure. The U.S. Census Bureau will keep your information private and it is illegal for the organization to share your information with other government agencies or private companies.

Keep in mind, a census worker will never ask for your Social Security number, information about your bank accounts, or credit cards.

If you want to make sure the person at your door is really a census worker, check their badge. All census workers have an official U.S. Census Bureau ID badge. The badge should include their name, picture, a Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date. They will also be carrying an official bag with the Census Bureau logo and an official letter explaining why they are visiting.



 *A \$55 reservation fee is required for all Resident Park Pavilion Reservations.
 *St. Louis County residents may reserve Howdershell and Musick Park pavilions ONLY. Reservations may be made no more than 30 days in advance of the requested date, depending on pavilion availability.
 *A \$75 reservation fee is required for these Non-Resident Park Pavilion Reservations.

Truman Park Pond Regulations:

Fishing is permitted dawn to dusk year round with a current resident ID card. 1 guest per resident. Regulations of poles and catches by City Ordinance 250.170. No swimming, wading or boating permitted. A Missouri fishing license is not required. Persons fishing shall comply with the following requirements:

- 1) One attended pole per person.
- 2) Each person shall have his own stringer.
- 3) No trotlines, limb lines, jug fishing, gigging or netting permitted.
- 4) No firearms or bow and arrow fishing permitted.
- 5) No frogging permitted.
- 6) No selling or exchanging of fish permitted.
- 7) Caught fish provisions:
 - A. If not kept, fish should be returned immediately to the pond, unharmed.
 - B. Minimum length for channel catfish and bass is twelve (12) inches.
 - C. Creel or possession limit: *Bass-Two (2) *Channel Catfish-Four (4)

Bike Routes:

White Birch Park/Howdershell Park Route: 4-mile round trip stretching between White Birch Park and the Village Square Complex.

Aubuchon and St. Cin park Route: 2.25-mile route, encompasses Aubuchon Park and St. Cin Park, crosses Coldwater Creek into Hazelcrest Condominiums.

Musick Park Route: 2-mile round trip through Musick park, across the AmerenUE right-of-way to Tally Ho Drive around neighborhood streets back to Musick Park.

Pershall Park Route: 2-mile route through residential neighborhoods including Pershall Park, Robinwing, Utz, Airshire, Norshire, and Fee Fee Hills.





Let the Hazelwood Community Center or Civic Center East be the site

of your next social gathering or business meeting. Areas within each of the centers are available for wedding receptions, family gatherings, showers, business meetings, etc. Rental fees include the set-up of tables and chairs, trash receptacles, and custodial services.

SENIOR AND ACCESSIBLE TRANSPORTATION-SPECIAL TRIPS

We are off to Perryville, MO to see the recently opened National Veterans Memorial which features a full scale model of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial identical to the Memorial in Washington, DC, a fully accessible welcome center and museum. Should you find it necessary to transfer session or class times, this may be done prior to the start of the session or class for which you are registered if an opening exists.

RETURNED CHECKS

Returned checks are assessed all bank fees charged to the City.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

The City of Hazelwood Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel or postpone any program due to insufficient enrollment or other valid reason. Full refund will be issued if a class is cancelled. If an individual cannot attend a class or program for any reason, refunds will be issued upon written request for classes as follows:

1. For activities with a fee of \$5 or less, a written request must be submitted before the program or first class meeting or NO REFUND will be given.
2. For activities with a fee of \$6 or more, a written request must be submitted within the first two class periods in order to receive a refund or transfer to another class. A \$5 service charge will be made for withdrawals after the first class meeting.
3. All trips and tours have registration deadlines. In order to receive a refund, a written request must be received prior to that deadline. After that, refunds will be given only if a replacement is found.

MINIMUM/MAXIMUM

All program/class fees are calculated on a minimum number of participants. If the set minimum is not met for any given class, the class will be cancelled and refunds will be made to those registered. It is recommended that you register a minimum of five days before the start of a program.



(Missouri Drivers License, state I.D., employment, education) and one of the following: UNPAID utility bill, received within the last 30 days, bearing your Hazelwood address, a monthly business statement, or your Personal Property Tax receipt. Assistance in determining other items which may be used for proof of residency is available by calling 731-0980. Non-Residents purchasing Premier Passes must also provide this information.


Photograph Policy


