City Gears Up to Host 5th Annual RECYCLING DAY

For the past four years, the City of Hazelwood has hosted a "Recycle Day" in early June to help educate residents about the importance of diverting recyclable items away from local landfills in order to preserve our planet's natural resources. At last year's event, our participating vendors collected these amounts, making it one of our biggest events: Midwest Recycling (MRC) – 54 tons; MERS/Goodwill – 15 tons; and Shred-It – 4 tons.

We want to thank those of you who participated in each of these events and waited patiently as each vehicle was unloaded. Since last year's event was so successful, the City of Hazelwood is planning to do it again! The 5th Annual Recycle Day is scheduled for Saturday, June 6, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The event location will be the parking lot of St. Louis Outlet Mall, near the IceZone.



This year's participants include Republic Services (formerly Allied Waste Services), Midwest Recycling, MERS/Goodwill, Shred-It and St. Louis Outlet Mall. Vender stations will be set up so drivers can pull up and have their vehicles unloaded.

Unfortunately, this year we will NOT be able to accept any televisions. We won't be able to collect these items either: fluorescent/regular light bulbs; alkaline batteries; smoke detectors; thermostats; construction/building materials; mattresses and box springs; tires; hazardous materials (paint solvents & chemicals); pianos and organs.

Midwest Recycling accepts most items with a power cord or uses batteries. Examples include computers, keyboards, monitors, printers, stereos, DVD/VHS players, CD/MP3 players, radios, large/small appliances, phones, fax machines, microwaves, dehumidifiers, cameras, power tools, etc. Other items such as lawn and garden equipment can be included as long as the gas is removed.

MERS/Goodwill will be on hand to collect furniture, baby items, case goods, books and games, CDs, athletic equipment, collectibles, antiques and giftware, household/domestics glassware, cookware, tools, and clothing/shoes/accessories of any kind for any age.

In addition, Shred-It will be on-site to shred personal documents and Republic Services will provide dumpsters for discarded single-stream recycling materials.

To help you with your spring cleaning, the City of Hazelwood is hosting its 16th Annual Community Clean-Up Campaign which starts on June 1st and continues through June 26th. This is above and beyond Recycle Day scheduled for Sat., June 6,

Bulky Waste Curbside Pick-Up (6/1 – 6/26)

As a Hazelwood resident, you are entitled to two (2) bulk collection pick-ups free of charge with your basic service with Republic. You must use one of them during the City's Clean-Up Campaign. A pick-up date for your street has been pre-selected. (Check the street list in the Parks & Rec Activity Guide, pages 29-30.) The second curbside pick-up can be scheduled at your convenience. When you call Customer Service at (636) 947-5959 to make the appointment, be sure to tell them that it's the second FREE bulky waste pick-up you get with your basic service. Hazelwood residents are limited to five (5) bulk items and each item cannot weigh more than 40 lbs.

Green Committee Continues Recycling Education Efforts and Keeping City Beautiful

- The City of Hazelwood's ad-hoc volunteer Green Committee has been busy educating residents about the importance of recycling and keeping the community beautiful with litter pick-up events. One of its members recently won a sturdy park bench, made of recycled #2 plastic milk jugs, through a Missouri Recycling Association auction. He donated it to the Parks and Recreation Division on behalf of the Green Committee. It sits among other benches near the Truman Park pond and blends in well with the other park structures.
- At a recent City Council meeting, Ron Darling, chairman of the Green Committee, was pleased to report that Republic Services (formerly Allied Waste Services) has awarded the committee a \$1,000 for their past and future efforts to increase recycling in Hazelwood.
- In 2015, they plan to roll out something new to encourage more residents to recycle. They're looking at doing a door-to-door campaign in certain neighborhoods to explain Hazelwood's recycling program. One-on-one individual contact has proven to be an effective way of reinforcing why it makes sense to recycle.

It also includes prices for individual and family season passes.

Hazelwood's \$5.7 million dollar Aquatic Center is still ranked among the best waterparks in the St. Louis area. It's most unique feature is a 360° bubble slide made in Sweden, which is the first of its kind to be used in the Midwest. Other fun amenities include the following: two lightning-fast water slides; a 600-ft. lazy river that generates waves; a giant bucket that dumps gallons of water over a colorful play structure for kids; a water swirl that spins swimmers in circles; and a little tot wave pool with spray features and a shark slide. The facility also has a 25-meter competition pool with two diving boards, and a full-service concession station equipped to provide hot food, cold treats and refreshing beverages.

White Birch Bay is available for private celebrations such as children's birthday parties, anniversaries, family reunions, and company parties for employees. However, after-hour teen parties are prohibited. There are a variety of party packages to choose from for groups up to 225 guests. All reservations require a \$75 damage deposit to secure a date. The remaining balance is due 10 days prior to the event date. Packages include waterpark admission with time slots available while the park is open to the public and for after-hour use Friday through Wednesday. No Thursday evening rentals. In 1998, the City purchased a pedestrian bridge, enabling easier access for disc golfers from the front nine to the back nine.

Through the years, Hazelwood has gone to great lengths to maintain the Community Center as a first-class recreation center. In addition to the routine upkeep required for a public facility, the following improvements have been made:

- 1995 – facility restrooms were renovated to comply with A.D.A. regulations
- 1995 – A wheelchair lift was installed, giving disabled patrons better access
- 2000 – The Parks and Recreation Office expanded into the Kline Lounge
- 2004 – the 30-year-old Universal Weight machine was replaced with Cybex strength equipment
- 2004 – Cardio equipment was added to the fitness area
- 2004 – A BMX/Skate Park was built on the concrete slab which was once the ice rink
- 2005 – a divider curtain was installed in the gym so 2 activities can be held at same time
- 2005-2011 – The old ice rink Warming Area used as office for Street Bond staff members
- 2010 – New light fixtures and heating/cooling system installed for City's energy saving program
- 2013 – The Warming Area was renovated into a party room to accommodate 100 people
- 2013 – Fitness area relocated to the area previously used as a game room. Upgrades included painting, acoustical panels, athletic flooring, mirrored walls, HD/TVs and Wi-Fi

In 2007, construction of the \$5.7 million dollar White Birch Bay Aquatic Center was completed, allowing the City of Hazelwood to open the doors of this new waterpark facility to residents. This Aquatic Center is ranked among the best waterpark facilities in the St. Louis area.
