### Special Recreation Needs

The City of Hazelwood strives to make recreation programs accessible to everyone. If you have a special need, in order to participate in a program, please inform office staff at the time of registration or call 731-0980 or by TDD 1-711 two weeks in advance between 8:00a.m. and 8:30p.m. Every effort will be made to adapt the program to incorporate your individual need.

### Acceptance of Participation

Rules of acceptance and participation in the following programs are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, national origin, age and disability.

### Photograph Policy

Photographs taken during programs and activities sponsored by the Hazelwood Parks and Recreation Division are the property of the City of Hazelwood and may be reproduced without consent of the participants.

### Program Registration

Registrations are on a first-come, first-served basis and are accepted until the enrollment is filled. It is recommended that you register a minimum of five days prior to the start of the program to ensure your spot in the class.

### Termination of Participation

Any park user, program participant, or spectator who strikes, attempts to strike, verbally threatens, or attempts to intimidate a Parks and Recreation employee or cause such employee or another park patron to be apprehensive about his/her personal safety; or who persists in the use of vulgar and inappropriate language in addressing an employee or at a Recreation program or facility; or who fails to heed the request of an on-site supervisor to vacate park property is subject to prosecution for violation of the City of Hazelwood trespassing ordinance and suspension from attendance at Recreation programs or facilities for a period to be determined by the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation.

### Bleeding Policy

In any Parks and Recreation program, a participant who is bleeding or who has blood on his/her clothing shall be prohibited from participating further in the activity until appropriate treatment has been administered. Appropriate treatment may include bandaging as necessary to prevent recurrence.

### Find a Mistake?

Hazelwood Parks and Recreation strives to provide activities for all ages and interests. Since some people like to find errors, we regularly include a few in our publication to meet this need.

## **Resident Identification Card**

A current Resident card is required, for ages 6 and over, for access to the Community Center and Civic Center East, to obtain picnic permits, admittance to White Birch Bay, to fish at Truman Park Pond, and to receive resident rates for classes and room rentals. Resident cards expire annually on December 31st. Card renewal is free with current proof of residency.

## **Proof of Residency Requirements**

Individuals, 18 years and older, must provide a valid photo I.D. (Missouri Drivers License, state I.D., employment, education) and one of the following: UNPAID utility bill, received within the last 30 days, bearing your Hazelwood address, a monthly business statement, or your Personal Property Tax receipt. Assistance in determining other items which may be used for proof of residency is available by calling 731-0980. Non-Residents purchasing Premier Passes must also provide this information.

## **Procedures**

1. Parents/Guardians may obtain resident cards for themselves and all other family members, ages 6 to 20, by presenting current proof of residency and photo ID and completing a resident card application. Because the resident card is printed immediately on site, all family members are encouraged to be present at the time of application.
2. Adult family members, 21 years of age and older, residing with parents/guardians must present their own current proof of residency and photo ID when applying for resident cards. They may not obtain cards for other family members.

## **Facility Usage**

An annual facility usage fee, *Premier Pass*, is required for access to the Community Center and Civic Center East amenities: gym, weight room, track and game room.

## **Daily Fee**

## **Guest Fee**

Hazelwood Residents and Non-Resident Premier Pass holders are allowed one guest to accompany them to the recreation centers. A daily guest fee is required for admittance to the facility. Guests, age 12 and over, must provide a photo I.D. **Members must accompany and remain with their guest.**

## REGISTRATION POLICIES

1. Registrations are on a first-come, first served basis and will continue until the classes are filled.
2. Resident cards must be current and presented at the time of registration to qualify for resident rates.
3. You may register for any class session. Registration in the first session does not guarantee a place in continuing classes.
4. Participants must reach the designated age by the first class.
5. Fees are calculated per session unless otherwise indicated.
6. Pre-registration is required for all programs unless otherwise indicated.

### SENIOR CITIZEN RATES

Residents, age 55 years and over, are entitled to a 50% discount for most CLASS registrations. A CLASS consists of any recreation offering which meets on a continuing weekly basis during a 4 week or greater session. This discount is not available for all programs and will be noted in the class description.

### TRANSFERS

Should you find it necessary to transfer session or class times, this may be done prior to the start of the session or class for which you are registered if an opening exists.

### RETURNED CHECKS

Returned checks are assessed bank fees as charged to the City.

## CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

The City of Hazelwood Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel or postpone any program due to insufficient enrollment or other valid reason. Full refund will be issued if a class is cancelled. If an individual cannot attend a class or program for any reason, refunds will be issued upon written request for classes as follows:

1. For activities with a fee of \$5 or less, a written request must be submitted before the program or first class meeting or NO REFUND will be given.
2. For activities with a fee of \$6 or more, a written request must be submitted within the first two class periods in order to receive a refund or transfer to another class. A \$5 service charge will be made for withdrawals after the first class meeting.
3. All trips and tours have registration deadlines. In order to receive a refund, a written request must be received prior to that deadline. After that, refunds will be given only if a replacement is found.

### MINIMUM/MAXIMUM

All program/class fees are calculated on a minimum number of participants. If the set minimum is not met for any given class, the class will be cancelled and refunds will be made to those registered.

**It is recommended that you register a minimum of five days before the start of a program.**



## HAZELWOOD TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Hazelwood Parks and Recreation provides free curbside bus transportation, to qualified City residents, for personal business such as doctor appointments, hair appointments, grocery shopping and banking. To qualify for this service you must:

- \*Be a City of Hazelwood resident.
- \*Be 55 years of age or older or disabled with medical verification.
- \*Complete and sign an application for service and submit it to the Recreation Office. Applications are available at both Recreation Offices.
- \*Applicant must not have any condition that requires special medical attention which might adversely affect the health of other participants riding the bus.
- \*Accommodations that may be needed are the responsibility of the rider: service animal, oxygen, personal assistance, walker, etc.

## MAKING A RESERVATION

- \*To make a reservation, call **839-5575**, Monday through Friday, 9:00a.m.-2:00p.m. Riders must call 48 hours in advance.
- \*Reservations will be made in 30 minute increments.
- \*Riders should be ready 30 minutes prior to their designated pick-up time. Be patient with the drivers who may be delayed at times due to traffic, road construction or other reasons.
- \*Appointments will be accepted up to one month in advance.
- \*Calls for service less than 48 hours in advance will be accommodated based on priorities and availability.
- \*Riders are limited to one trip per day and two per week. Riders are accommodated according to the below Priority Rating Scale:
  1. Medical
  2. Grocery Shopping
  3. Financial Business, Post Office
  4. Shopping, Recreational, etc.
- \*Cancellations should be made 24 hours in advance when possible, however, cancellations on shorter notice should still be called in to the recreation office.



### Truman Park Pond Regulations:

Fishing is permitted dawn to dusk year round with a current resident ID card. 1 guest per resident. Regulations of poles and catches by City Ordinance 250.170. No swimming, wading or boating permitted. A Missouri fishing license is not required. Persons fishing shall comply with the following requirements:

- 1) One attended pole per person.
- 2) Each person shall have his own stringer.
- 3) No trotlines, limb lines, jug fishing, gigging or netting permitted.
- 4) No firearms or bow and arrow fishing permitted.
- 5) No frogging permitted.
- 6) No selling or exchanging of fish permitted.
- 7) Caught fish provisions:
  - A. If not kept, fish should be returned immediately to the pond, unharmed.
  - B. Minimum length for channel catfish and bass is twelve (12) inches.
  - C. Creel or possession limit:
    - \*Bass-Two (2)
    - \*Channel Catfish-Four (4)

### Bike Routes:

White Birch Park/Howdershell Park Route: 4-mile round trip stretching between White Birch Park and the Village Square Complex.

Aubuchon and St Cin park Route: 2.25-mile route, encompasses Aubuchon Park and St. Cin Park, crosses Coldwater Creek into Hazelcrest Condominiums.

Musick Park Route: 2-mile round trip through Musick park, across the AmerenUE right-of-way to Tally Ho Drive around neighborhood streets back to Musick Park.

Pershall Park Route: 2-mile route through residential neighborhoods including Pershall Park, Robinwing, Utz, Airshire, Norshire, and Fee Fee Hills.

# CLEAN UP

## C A M P A I G N

### 18th Annual City of Hazelwood Community Clean-up Campaign

The campaign schedule begins June 1st, and continues through July 1st

#### City of Hazelwood 6th Annual Recycle Day – Saturday, June 4th, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Bring all your recyclable goods to St. Louis Outlet Mall for City of Hazelwood's 6th Annual Recycle Day. Participating vendors accepting your donations on-site include Midwest Recycling, Salvation Army and Shred-It.

● **Midwest Recycling** collects most items that use a power cord or batteries. Examples are computers, radios, speakers, mice, keyboards, large and small appliances, toasters, blenders, phones, printers, fax machines, microwaves, dehumidifiers, cameras, power tools, etc... Other accepted items include lawn and garden equipment, as long as the gas is removed.

● **Salvation Army** will be on hand to accept furniture, baby items, (cribs, walkers, strollers, clothing, toys, etc.) case goods, books and games, CDs, athletic equipment, collectibles, antiques and giftware, household/domestics, glassware, cookware, tools, and clothing/shoes/accessories of any kind for any age.

● In addition, **Shred-It** will be on-site to shred personal documents and **Allied Waste Services** will provide dumpsters for discarded single stream recycling materials.

Items **NOT** accepted by vendors include: **televisions, monitors**, light bulbs, alkaline batteries, smoke detectors, thermostats, construction/building materials, mattresses and box springs, tires, **hazardous materials (paints, solvents & chemicals)** pianos, and organs.

#### Bulky Waste Curbside Pick-Up - June 6th through July 1st

All Hazelwood residents are entitled to **two (2) bulk collection pick-ups free of charge** with their basic service with Allied. One pre-scheduled pick-up takes place during the month of June for Hazelwood's Community Clean-Up Campaign. (*See attached schedule*) The other curbside pick-up can be scheduled at your convenience. When you are calling to make your 2nd appointment, (636) 947-5959, be sure to tell the Allied customer service representative that it's the second **FREE** bulky waste pick-up you get with your basic service.

**Hazelwood residents are limited to five (5) items for each pick-up and the items cannot weigh more than forty (40) pounds. No E-waste/TV/computer items can be included.**

- **Acceptable** bulky waste items include sofas, mattresses, chairs, cabinets, tables, tubs, sinks, vanities, lamps, wooden or plastic furniture, playground equipment, and rugs.
- **Unacceptable** items include tires, automotive parts, batteries, appliances containing Freon, construction materials, concrete, compost, flammable liquids, household chemicals or paint.

#### Additional Community Clean-Up campaign Choices

##### White Goods Curbside Pick-Up - June 6th through July 1st

All Hazelwood residents may leave unwanted white good items at their own curbside. The City of Hazelwood will be divided up into sections throughout the entire clean-up campaign. Allied Waste will charge \$15.00 per White Good during the June campaign. **Residents will have to call Allied Waste at 636-947-5959 to schedule a White Good pick-up.** White Good items include dishwashers, water heaters, refrigerators (doors removed and/or locks disabled), air conditioners (No FREON), microwaves, washers and dryers.

##### Outdoor Home Improvement Incentive - Entire month of June

Bring this campaign flyer and a valid driver's license to the following local business establishment and receive a ten (10%) percent discount on outdoor household merchandise and/or nursery items. The participant is **Waldbart & Sons Nursery** (5517 N. Highway 67). This business has final approval of all discounted merchandise.

##### Usable Item Pickup – Available anytime

While cleaning out those bulky waste items and white goods for curbside pickups, don't forget to set aside unwanted but usable items for charitable organizations that serve the city. Most pick up clothing, books, toys, kitchen items, household goods, etc. Contact the organizations listed below to make arrangements for pickup of items at your home during the clean-up campaign:

**Adopt-A-Highway/County Road Program** - Available anytime
